Donna Brazile, former DNC chair, will talk politics with Republican Ana Navarro at Miami Book Fair

The event is set for 8 p.m. Nov. 15 at the Chapman Conference Center on Miami Dade College's Wolfson Campus, 300 NE Second Ave. Tickets are \$15.

Brazile and Navarro aren't the only political speakers on the schedule. The fair kicks off Nov. 12 with journalist Dan Rather and his book “What Unites Us: Reflections on Patriotism” and ends at 6:30 p.m. Nov. 19 with Sen. Al Franken and his memoir “Al Franken, Giant of the Senate.” Tickets to Rather's event are \$35; tickets to the Franken event are free with street fair admission. They go on sale to the public at 10 a.m. Nov. 6.

Former vice president Joe Biden will also talk about his new book “Promise Me, Dad: A Year of Hope, Hardship, and Purpose” at 7 p.m. Nov. 18 at the Adrienne Arsht Center. Tickets are \$36, are on sale now and include a copy of the book. There will be shuttles running from the fair to the Arsht if you don't want to move your car; find them at Second Avenue and Fifth Street.
