## Heads of Miami Dade College, University of Miami named to list of best college presidents

Presidents at two Florida colleges have been named as some of the country's best.

Eduardo J. Padrón, of Miami Dade College, and Julio Frenk, of the University of Miami, rank ninth and 25th, respectively, according to Great Value Colleges, a website whose goal, through high-quality, research-based articles and rankings, is to "help you get the most bang for your buck when it comes to getting a college degree."

About Miami Dade College's Padrón, it writes: "Since that time, (Padrón) has established the InterAmerican Campus, the Tamiami Aviation Center; increased the college's offering to include four year degrees; established an honors college; opened the West Campus, the Confucius Institute, a new science complex, a culinary institute, an entrepreneurship and innovation hub, a state-of-the-art animation and gaming hub; and enrolled more than 1 million students."

On Feb. 1, after almost 50 years at Miami Dade, Padrón announced he would step down from the post in August. He has been president since 1995.

About the University of Miami's Frenk, it writes: "Although Julio Frenk's tenure as president of the University of Miami only started relatively recently, in 2015, he has already done incredible things for the college. For instance, in 2017, Forbes ranked the University of Miami as the 15th best employer in America. It never had previously ranked on the list. It also ranked as the 44th best college worldwide in Times Higher Education's 2018 ranking."

Topping Great Value College's list is West Virginia University's E. Gordon Gee.

About Gee: "What puts E. Gordon Gee ahead of all the competition is there has never been an American with more college president experience. He has been the president of more universities than any person, living or dead. The other colleges he has run are all prestigious, including Vanderbilt, Brown and the University of Colorado. Initially, Gee was president of the college from 1981 to 1985. He resumed the presidency in

2014. Gee still takes time to consider every student's needs and makes 'it a point to visit students where they live, learn and socialize.' "

To begin its research, Great Value Colleges consulted online sources, including The Washington Post, Time, Forbes, the Chronicle of Higher Education and U.S. News, that highlight which college presidents are notable. Then, it expanded from the sources and applied the sources' criteria to a range of respectable colleges and their presidents.
