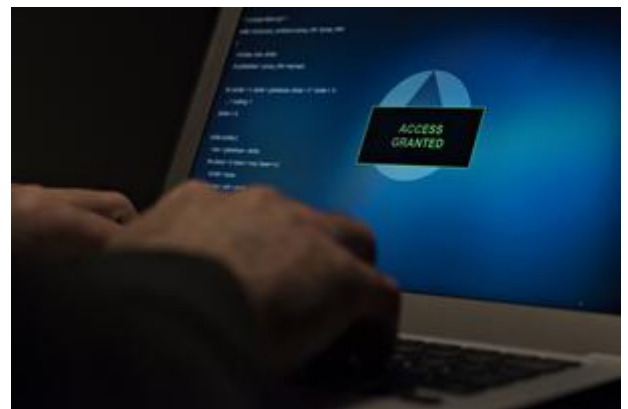


College to host cybersecurity conference and unite LatAm with Israeli industry leaders

From private email servers to Russian hacking, cybersecurity had its moment in the spotlight during Monday night's presidential debate. Come Thursday, the topic will hit closer to home, taking center stage at Miami-Dade College's Wolfson Campus in downtown Miami.

The college's Idea Center, in collaboration with Tel Aviv University, will host CyberMiami, a one-day technology conference featuring cybersecurity experts from business, education and intelligence fields.

“We live in an increasingly risky world, from private information, personal banking and government infrastructure,” said **Leandro Finol**, executive director of The Idea Center at MDC. “Cyber risk should be at the top of the agenda of both executives and the general public.”

Taking place Thursday at 9 a.m., CyberMiami will be a forum where leaders in the cybersecurity space will discuss issues relevant to the topic of safety on the web, Finol said.

The speaker lineup includes Inon Elroy, Economic Minister of North America; **David Gladshstein**, director of business at Israeli cybersecurity firm Minerva Labs; and **Shay Zandani**, CEO of Cytegit, an Israeli cybersecurity outfit with U.S. headquarters in Hackensack, New Jersey.

CyberMiami is aimed at connecting the business ecosystem of Latin American with top entrepreneurs from the U.S. and Israel, where more than 400 cybersecurity firms currently operate.
